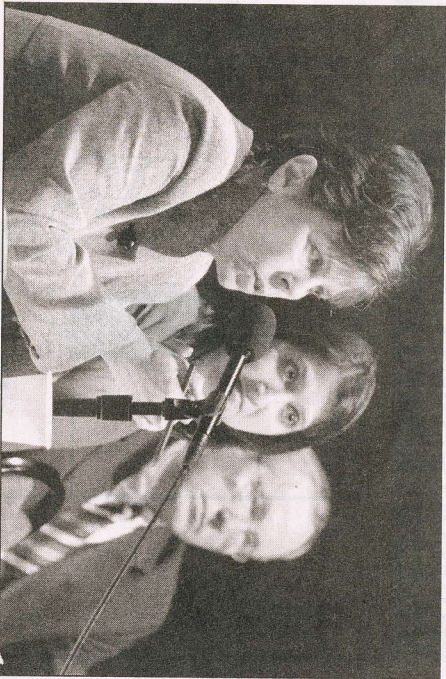


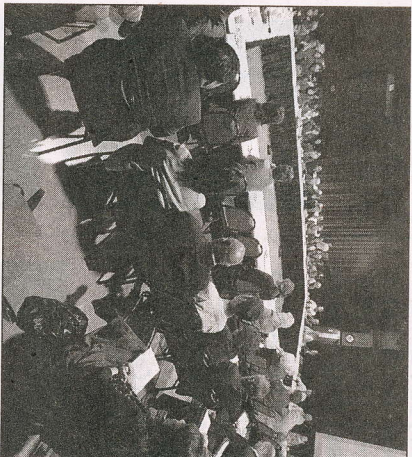
P2 brings health leaders together
